

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF
THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE, N.C.
December 10, 1974

The meeting was called to order at 7:32 P.M. December 10, 1974 by Mayor Paul Wilson.

Mayor Wilson asked for the minutes of the regular meeting held on November 19, 1974 be read. There being no comments Jim Nance, Commissioner made a motion they be accepted as read. Mr. Cothran seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Wilson then asked for the minutes of the Special Meeting held on November 29, 1974 be read. The purpose of this meeting was to open sealed bids from several automobile dealers for the purchase of a Police car. Mayor Wilson asked for comments. There being none Commissioner Nance made a motion and Commissioner Cothran seconded they be accepted as read. The vote was unanimous.

The Chair asked if there was any business to be presented to the Board. Mayor Wilson reconized Mrs. Burch who presented an outline on naming and numbering the streets. It was proposed that the streets already named would not be changed and the other unnamed streets be numbered using two digit numbers. After discussing the project it was decided that Mrs. Burch proceed with the plans. Commissioner Nance made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Don Cothran, to proceed. The vote was unanimous.

A citizen, Mr Ficker, requested of the Town that its' position concerning John Burroughs Road be stated for the record. He further stated that the road had been open and maintained. He also stated Clyde Flynn was aware of this matter. Mr Flynn was present at the meeting and stated he was a Town employee from 1929 thru 1932 and that he graded and graveled John Burroughs Road including both entrances from Highway 74 and that he hauled garbage which was dumped at a point above John Burroughs Road. He made entrance from one end and exit from the other. It was reported by Mayor Wilson that after inspection of minutes it did not appear that the Town of Lake Lure at any time abandoned its rights to John Burroughs Road. It was felt by the Board, it was not necessary at the present time to reopen the road however they wish to retain their rights to reopen and maintain the road for residents if it becomes necessary in the future. It was pointed out that driveways located on the road right of way at the present time were permissible and the Town would not object to its use but the Town Board wished to reserve its rights in the future at anytime to reopen the road and revoke the permission given for its present use by others.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
