

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE
TOWN OF LAKE LURE, N.C.
MAY 27, 1980

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held in the Community Building May 27, 1980 at 7:30 p.m. The following members were present: Mayor J. Paul Wilson, Commissioners David Bond, J. Woodrow Price, William O Keller, Henry E Rainey and Town Attorney Martin L. Nesbitt.

Mayor Wilson opened the meeting by introducing Town Engineer Roger Lyda. Mr. Lyda gave an update of the progress made on the 201 Facilities study. He said a number of years were spent to find a method that would be acceptable to the E.P.A. He explained the process that had been involved in securing the hydrophonic equipment necessary for this study. Dr. Minhinick has been working on a device to filter certain unwanted sounds such as noise from over head lines and the power plant. Work on the study should begin the end of this week or first of next.

Mr. Roy Davis, who is with Environmental Management, asked if they had all the equipment that was needed and Mr. Lyda's reply was "yes we do have it all." There was a discussion as to whether the lake should or should not be closed to boat traffic during this study. Mayor Wilson said the hydrophonic work will start without closing the lake to boats, but should it be necessary the Board is willing to take that step. The Mayor asked Mr. Carl Brown if he would allow the men to use his pontoon boat for this study and if he would be interested in accompanying them. He said his boat would be at their disposal and he would be free after Wednesday.

Minutes of a regular meeting held on April 22nd were read. Motion was made by Commissioner Bond, seconded by Commissioner Keller they be accepted as read and the vote was unanimous.

As part of old business Mayor Wilson reported on a special meeting with the Zoning Boards concerning requests for rezoning. All requests to date have been turned over to the Planning Board for study. He suggested interested parties watch the papers for notice of a public hearing.

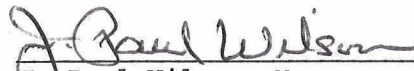

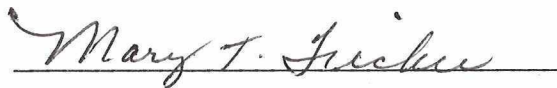
Mr. Joe Bell asked how the fortune telling business got started and was informed by the Mayor it was in direct violation of the zoning ordinance and something would be done about it.

Carl Brown asked what had been done since last month's meeting about irresponsible boat traffic and Mr. Nesbitt said he had checked with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and was informed the lake must be open for public use. After discussion, Mayor Wilson suggested the Board appoint a committee of five to investigate the problem and make recommendations.

Mrs. Bociek complimented our Golf Pro, Stan Sisk, for doing a marvelous job at the golf course.

There being no further business motion was made by Commissioner Rainey, seconded by Commissioner Bond the meeting be adjourned. The vote was unanimous.
