

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE

November 19, 1984

A Special Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure was held, Monday, November 19, 1984 at 4:30 p.m. in the Community Center Building. Those present were Mayor Charles F. Hicks, Commissioners Cashion and Price.

Motion was made by Commissioner Price, seconded by Commissioner Cashion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting. The vote was unanimous.

Motion was made by Commissioner Cashion, seconded by Commissioner Price to recess the meeting until Tuesday, November 20, 1984, at 6:00 p.m. in the Community Center. The vote was unanimous.

The meeting was reconvened at 6:15. Those present were Mayor Charles F. Hicks, Commissioners Queen, Cashion, Gruver, and Price and the Town Manager Peter F. Lydens.

Motion was made by Commissioner Cashion, seconded by Commissioner Gruver to dispense with the minutes of the last meeting. The vote was unanimous.

Motion was made by Commissioner Gruver, seconded by Commissioner Price to accept the 15 volunteers listed below as members of the Appearance Commission, with the understanding that if Bob Corbett is not a resident of Lake Lure, the position be offered to Mrs. John Mojjis. The vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Cashion made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Price to go into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing a personnel problem. The vote was unanimous.


Motion was made by Commissioner Cashion, seconded by Commissioner Price to return to open session. The vote was unanimous.


Commissioners Cashion and Price in favor.
