Papillion Police Department Promotes Maas, Habrock and McClannan to Sergeants

PAPILLION, Nebraska, November, 17, 2015 – The Papillion Police Department has promoted Preston Maas, Corey Habrock and Kurt McClannan each to the rank of sergeant.

Maas, Habrock and McClannan together have nearly 40 years of combined law enforcement experience and service to the Papillion community. All three have held numerous positions within the department. As sergeants, their primary duties will be supervision of the Papillion Police Department's patrol shifts.

Sgt. Preston Maas joined the Papillion Police Department in March 1998. He has held positions in road patrol and investigations, and served as a field training officer and SWAT team member. Most recently, Preston served as the narcotics detective assigned to the Metro Drug Task Force since July 2011. Maas currently serves as a leader of the South Metro SWAT team and is on the department's Police Pension Board.

Sgt. Corey Habrock joined the Papillion Police Department in March 1998. He left briefly in September 2007 to pursue work in the private sector, but returned to the department in January 2009. Corey has held positions in both road patrol and investigations, and currently serves as one of the department's field training officers responsible for training new recruits. He also possesses tactical experience as a former member of the South Metro SWAT team.

Sgt. Kurt McClannan joined the Papillion Police Department in December 2005. He began his career in law enforcement with the Sarpy County Sheriff's Department in 1994. Prior to joining the Papillion Police Department, he earned his master's degree in theology in 2002 and worked as a youth pastor in Central City, Neb., until 2005. During his time with the department, Kurt has served in both uniformed patrol and the Crime Prevention Unit. Most recently, he served as the department's CALEA accreditation manager and aided the department in obtaining its first reaccreditation in July 2015. He also serves as a member of the South Metro SWAT team and is one of the department's defensive tactics instructors.

"All three of these individuals bring tremendous experience and ability to their new positions. They have demonstrated a level of dedication and commitment to the Papillion Police Department and the community that I know will lead to continued success and many great accomplishments," said Papillion Police Chief Scott Lyons. "I'm proud to promote each of them to the rank of sergeant and congratulate them on their new positions."
