Papillion Police Department Promotes Young, Prazan to Lieutenants

PAPILLION, Nebraska, November 9, 2015 – The Papillion Police Department has promoted Steve Young and Jerry Prazan each to the rank of lieutenant.

Young and Prazan together have nearly 60 years of combined law enforcement service to the Papillion Police Department. Both were formerly sergeants within the department. As lieutenants, their primary duties will be command and oversight of the Papillion Police Department's patrol division.

Lt. Young joined the Papillion Police Department in August 1982. In 1992, he was promoted and became one of the department's first sergeants. He is a graduate of Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command and also has prior SWAT experience. Young currently serves as the president of the department's Police Pension Board.

Lt. Prazan joined the Papillion Police Department in July 1989. He was promoted to sergeant in March 1994. He has twice served the department as acting lieutenant and also has prior SWAT experience. Prazan currently serves the department in managing its fleet and as firearms custodian.
