The Payson Police Department **Volunteers In Policing** will contact these citizens with a friendly call to ask "How are you doing?" The program is called **P.A.T.H.** (**P**olice **A**ccess **T**o **H**omebound.) Please refer your loved one to this program, whether they are ill, elderly, homebound or someone who would just like to hear a friendly voice in the morning to see how they are doing.

P.A.T.H. Information Continued

The **Volunteers In Policing** program will interview the citizen to make them aware of the program and to obtain specific information. All information will be kept confidential at the Payson Police Department. In the event the citizen is unable to be contacted by telephone after several attempts, the appropriate agency will be dispatched to check the welfare. Citizens recently released from the hospital who are convalescing and need to be checked up on are encouraged to participate as well. Sign up your neighbor or loved one today so that they can be contacted and begin receiving a daily phone call from a friendly **VIP** Volunteer.
