"AFTER-HOURS" CALLS FOR SERVICE

The City of Shenandoah received 139 "after hours" phone calls during November 2016. The Conroe Police Department Communications Center provides non-emergency after-hours dispatching services for the Shenandoah Police Department, which includes relay of information for Public Works issues.

SHENANDOAH PATROLS AND THE WOODLANDS TOWNSHIP ACTIVITIES

During the month of December 2016, Shenandoah officers conducted 268 residential patrols, 536 commercial patrols, and 124 dedicated AOR patrols; logging more than 1263:39 patrol hours specific to the City of Shenandoah. Additionally, 325 patrols were performed within the extended service area; logging more than 329 hours of activity specific to The Woodlands Township, as demonstrated by the chart below:

Total time dedicated to The Woodlands Township service: 329:37 hours / 11 hours per day. Agency assists include alarm, suspicious persons, MVA, felony traffic stop, multiple disturbances in progress and a death investigation.

The "per day" time is based upon a full 24-hour cycle, or two 12 hour shifts. Each shift is responsible for at least six hours of patrol time within the service agreement area, per shift, barring any critical issues affecting the City of Shenandoah.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT OPERATIONS

In November 2016, Shenandoah officers initiated 262 traffic stops while engaged in 263:30 hours of dedicated traffic enforcement activities, as indicated below:
