

SUBJECT: Police Tahoe and Public Works Pick-up Truck. (Agenda Item)

Pricing for the above referenced items was obtained through the Northwest Municipal Conference Suburban Purchasing Cooperative.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the awards be made to Currie Motors, Frankfort, IL in the amount of \$26,715 and to Freeway Ford, Lyons, IL in the amount of \$19,121

Comments:

FY 2014 Capital Improvements Program includes funding for the replacement of one (1) evidence technician unit. This year, we are purchasing one (1) Chevrolet Tahoe (\$26,715) for the evidence technician unit. The evidence technician vehicle requires more storage room than is available in a sedan due to the significant amount of evidence equipment and containment devices necessary for field operations.

At the recommendation of the Automotive Superintendent, the new Tahoe will replace the existing Evidence Technician Tahoe which will have over 90,000 miles, which is consistent with Village vehicle replacement and maintenance policy. The cost to reinstall the light bars, radio installations, vehicle identification markings and equipment set-up of the replacement vehicle is anticipated to be approximately \$7,000.

The new pickup truck (Ford F-150) will replace the truck used by the Village Forester that will be 12 years old and has reached the end of its useful life. This truck is experiencing substantial corrosion on the body, frame and suspension components. The new pickup will be undercoated to help prolong its useful life.

The vehicles being replaced will be sold at the Northwest Municipal Conference Auction, as the new vehicles are placed into service.

The Village has successfully dealt with Currie Motors and Freeway Ford for Municipal vehicles in the past.
