**SUBJECT: Purchase of Public Works Pick-up with plow & Health Department
Pick-up Truck (Agenda Item)**

Pricing for the replacement of two (2) pick-up trucks was obtained through the Northwest Municipal Conference Suburban Purchasing Cooperative.

Recommendation:
It is recommended that the award for two (2) pick-up trucks be made to Currie Motors, Frankfort, IL, in the amount of \$ 55,747.

Comments:
The FY2015 CIP budget provides funding for replacement of two (2) pick-up trucks. One (1) for the Health Department Animal Control Division and one (1) for the Public Works Department.

The Health Department's Animal Control vehicle is an upgrade from an intermediate pick-up truck to a full sized model. The upgrade is necessary due to the specialized animal transport module body being installed on this chassis. The transport module will be bought and installed on the chassis under a separate contract. The current vehicle will have accrued in excess of 70,000 miles at time of replacement. The unit is badly worn on

the interior and exterior from constant use. The suspension system and driveline have deteriorated as well.

The Public Works Pick-up truck that will be replaced is currently a 2005 F-250 4X4 that is used on a daily bases for Street Division activities including plowing for snow removal operations. The current vehicle will have accrued in excess of 45,000 miles at time of replacement and is showing signs of accelerated corrosion due to exposure of de-icing chemicals.

The Village has successfully dealt with previous acquisitions from Currie Motors, Frankfort, IL. The new units will be 2015 Ford F series pick-up trucks. The retired vehicle will be disposed of through the Northwest Municipal Conference Auction.
