

SUBJECT: Purchase of two (2) Public Works Pick-up trucks. (Agenda Item)

Pricing for the replacement of two (2) pick-up trucks was obtained through the Northwest Municipal Conference Suburban Purchasing Cooperative.

Recommendation:
It is recommended that the award for two (2) pick-up trucks be made to Currie Motors, Frankfort, IL, in the amount of \$ 57,285.

Comments:
The FY2016 CIP budget provides funding for replacement of two (2) pick-up trucks. One (1) for the Building Maintenance Division and one (1) for the Refuse Collection Division.

The Building Maintenance Division Pick-up truck that will be replaced is currently a 2003 Pick-up truck that is used on a daily bases for building maintenance activities. The current vehicle will have accrued in excess of 65,000 miles at time of replacement. The undercarriage components of this vehicle have become corroded due to exposure of de-icing chemicals and the vehicle is becoming less reliable.

The Refuse Division Pick-up truck that will be replaced is currently a 2005 Pick-up truck that is used on a daily bases for refuse collection activities including picking up refuse

and yard waste. The current vehicle will have accrued in excess of 85,000 miles at time of replacement and is experiencing frequent mechanical break downs and is showing signs of accelerated corrosion due to exposure of de-icing chemicals.

The Village has successfully dealt with previous acquisitions from Currie Motors, Frankfort, IL. The new units will be 2016 Ford F series pick-up trucks. The retired vehicles will be disposed of through the Northwest Municipal Conference Auction.
