

Recommendation:
It is recommended that a contract for the purchase of the replacement dump truck chassis, body, salt spreader and plows be awarded to Transchicago Truck Group, Elmhurst, IL, in the amount of \$155,517. This price total includes a trade-in allowance of \$12,000 for the dump truck being replaced.

Comments:
The FY 2018 CIP includes funding for the replacement of one (1) dump truck, underbody plow, plow and spreader for the Streets and Alley Division. The truck to be replaced, unit #157, is used for hauling stone for alley grading, asphalt for roadway repairs and dirt for stumping operations. This vehicle is also fitted with a plow and salt spreader to assist in snow and ice control operations. Unit #157 is a 2005 dump truck which currently has mileage in excess of 68,000 miles. This vehicle has been subjected to heavy hauling loads, which exposes the frame and suspension systems to fatigue. Additionally, it has been exposed to the harsh elements of winter and road salt, and has significant corrosion

of the truck dump body. While the bid is in excess of the budgeted amount, funds for the overage are available from savings from the replacement aerial lift truck purchase.

The Village has purchased trucks from Transchicago Truck Group in the past, and staff has been satisfied with the vehicles and equipment that they have provided.
