

**SUBJECT: FY 2018 Police Patrol and Administrative Vehicles (Agenda Item)**

Pricing for the above referenced items was obtained through the Northwest Municipal Suburban Purchasing Cooperative.

Budget Amount: \$ 204,500 020-6000-407.07-42

Tabulation:

Currie Motors Inc., Frankfort, IL \$161,146 (5 Ford Utility Police Interceptors)

Recommendation:

It is recommended that a contract for the purchase of five (5) Ford Utility Police Interceptors be awarded to Currie Motors, Frankfort, IL, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, in the amount of \$ 161,146.

Comments:

The FY 2018 Capital Improvements Program includes funding for the replacement of three (3) patrol vehicles and two (2) administrative vehicles for the Police Department. This year, we are purchasing five (5) of the all-wheel-drive Ford Utility Police Interceptors.

At the recommendation of the Automotive Supervisor, the new vehicles will replace the existing vehicles in the Police Department that have between 80,000 and 100,000 miles of usage, which is consistent with the Village vehicle replacement and maintenance

policy. The cost to reinstall the light bars, radios, vehicle identification markings and equipment set-up of the replacement vehicles is anticipated to be approximately \$9,000 per vehicle. This year's Northwest Municipal Suburban Purchasing Cooperative contract pricing was compared to other groups and individual pricing for vehicles. Staff is confident that this is the best value available to the Village. The vehicles being replaced will be sold at the Northwest Municipal Conference Auction as the new vehicles are placed into service.

The Village has successfully dealt with Currie Motors for Police vehicles in the past.
