ISSUE

Requesting approval from the Village Board of the Liquor License Overlay Permits for Fiscal Year 2024-2025.

DISCUSSION

At the December 6, 2022 meeting, the Village Board approved a new Liquor License Ordinance, which streamlined liquor license classifications and created new overlay permits for Bring Your Own Beer/Beverage (BYOB) and a Food Service Waiver. The BYOB permit allows for patrons to bring their own beverages on premise and the Food Service Waiver provides for a liquor license holder to sell liquor without the requirement of food service, currently defined as 15% of total food sales. Rosewood Farm has applied for a BYOB permit while Rosewood Farm and the Sugar Grove American Legion have applied for the Food Service Waiver as noted in the attached letters.

COST

There is no cost to approve the permits. There is \$100 of revenue for the BYOB permit.

RECOMMENDATION

That the President and the Board of Trustees approve Liquor License Overlay Permits for Fiscal Year 2024-2025 as follows:
