1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by President Stillwell at 6:00 pm.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

President Stillwell asked everyone to join her in the pledge of allegiance.

3. Roll Call

On September 1, 2026, the Village Board meeting was held in person at the Sugar Grove Library.

11. General Business

a. **Ordinance: Final Plat of Subdivision Kaneland School District Transportation Facility.**

Director Marion state that the board had recently approved a Final PUD for the transportation facility for the Kaneland School District. During the planning process it was determined that the 126-acre parcel has not yet been annexed to Fox Metro. After approaching Fox Metro, they said the entire parcel would need to be annexed, the facility itself will take on about 9 acres of this parcel.

The cost to annex this large of a parcel is very expensive and in an attempt to not have to endure those fees, the School District has come forward with a Final Plat of Subdivision subdividing the parcel into a 45-acre parcel.

Director Marion mentioned that this has gone to the Plan Commission and they recommended approval. Staff are recommending approval subject to final engineering due to all the final engineering being completed with the final PUD.

Trustee Michels said he is surprised Kaneland would still owe any fees because they did system wide improvements. Director Marion said she believes the parcel the school sits on was annexed and the second parcel has been sitting vacant and was never annexed. Trustee Michels asked if part of lot 2 was never annexed, Director Marion clarified what has and has not been annexed on a map.

Dan K. working on the architecture for this project added that only the portion of Harter Middle School was annexed, lot 1 & 2 were not a part of that annexation.

Motion by Trustee Michels, seconded by Trustee Speciale, to discuss and approve a Final Plat of Subdivision Kaneland School District Transportation Facility.

Administrator Koepfel explained that this temporary license is for an event that is being held at Rich Harvest Farms with Fireside Grille. It is a wine event and in order for this event to occur a liquor license was needed.

13. Discussion Items

a. Separate legal counsel for the Village Trustees to properly provide governance and oversight of operations. (Item added by Trustees.)

Motion by Trustee Roskopf, seconded by Trustee Bonnie, to discuss Separate legal counsel for the Village Trustees to properly provide governance and oversight of operations. (Item added by Trustees.)

Trustee Lendi said this came about after the JRB Meeting and the August 18th Board Meeting. She was concerned about the unprofessionalism that was presented at the meetings and questions by other attorneys on legalities. She wanted to know who was giving President Stillwell advice, and she requested any communications between the Village President and the Village Attorney, and it fell under attorney client privilege. This made her question how she can find out and how they can get the best advice. She was also given information on what the rules of Trustee and President are, she said taken from the email is that the Trustee are to ensure the proper government oversight of operations. She questioned how this could be done without seeing all the information from the attorney. This brought up the idea of getting a separate attorney for the Trustees.

President Stillwell wanted to speak on behalf of Vasselli Law, she feels they have always done a great job. She explained that there have been certain projects that Vasselli Law has handled for the Village such as the motel and the Hanks Road Bridge helping save money and continue the project. She feels another law firm would just be another expense to taxpayers when the real issue is that certain Trustees want her to behave differently and attributing things she does to Vasselli Law.

Trustee Roskopf added that when President Stillwell asks a question, she gets an answer from the attorneys, but the Trustees do not. President Stillwell feels that these concerns can be expressed to Vasselli Law to improve the communication. She explained that Trustee Lendi had asked for copies of all communications, Trustee Lendi said that is incorrect she asked for anything that had to do with EEI, Crown, the Data Center Study, flooding, etc.

Amalia Rioja from Vasselli Law said their role is to provide guidance on FOIA and responses and they are as transparent as they can be although there are exemptions that may apply. She said that every board operates differently and the mayor takes the lead but if asked the attorneys can provide information, she said they are here to help.

Trustee Lendi said President Stillwell mentioned that she had talked to the Village Attorneys about the requested communications and was told attorney client privilege and confidentiality separated the president and the board. Trustee Lendi asked for more information, and she never got a response. Attorney Rioja said she would look at this FOIA again, Trustee Lendi said this was just a request not a FOIA and she was told attorney client privilege. She thought the Village Attorney worked for the Village Board as well, Attorney Rioja said yes, the client is the Village.

Trustee Roskopf asked if there was any attorney client privilege for the mayor, he feels the board should be able to know about ongoing issues. Attorney Rioja said he is not wrong although there are some situations where issues relate to employees or personnel that wouldn't fall under the board supervision. As far as general advice, it is advice for the public body and directives come from the mayor.

President Stillwell stated that she did not say to deny Trustee Lendi's whole request, she was willing to provide whatever she wanted. Attorney Rioja had some confusion about whether this

was an informal request or not. Trustee Lendi asked Administrator Koepfel if he spoke to Attorney Vasselli on this, he said yes and then Attorney Miller was the one who sent her a response. He wanted to add that in code it is listed that the Village President has access to all records and it is silent on what Trustees have access too.

Attorney Miller said that Trustee Lendi had a very large document request, but he mentioned that this documentation will be provided. Trustee Lendi asked if she needs to FOIA her own attorney to get this information, Attorney Miller said no it will be provided. President Stillwell said she was told it was being handled on the Village level and it was her understanding that Administrator Koepfel was sending the information. She said to resolve this she is fine with Trustee Lendi having information and to have Administrator Koepfel send her the information. He reiterated that he was unaware if information couldn't be sent between the board from the president which is why the attorneys were contacted.

Trustee Bonnie asked why this was not understood before and why did a conversation need to happen with another attorney for an explanation regarding attorney client privilege. Attorney Miller said looking at the request it was relating to 5 very broad topics, Trustee Lendi repeated what it was regarding. Attorney Miller stated that this was a very extensive request and at the time it was not understood. Trustee Lendi read aloud her full request for the board and Attorney Miller said it was a very extensive request and gave a timeline of emails. She added that it wasn't until August 26th until she received a response, Attorney Miller said on the 25th he provided an opinion.

Attorney Rioja said to keep in mind that any information that is shared that it's important for the Trustees to maintain the privilege.

Trustee Lendi said how does she know what advice is being given and information she isn't aware of.

President Stillwell said Administrator Koepfel will send the information to her; she stated that she wants this to be sent to the entire board.

President Stillwell said she is transparent as she could be when Trustee Lendi said she often finds out information from social media. President Stillwell said she offered to send anything Trustee Lendi wanted and additional legal counsel for Trustees is an additional taxpayer expense.

President Stillwell asked Attorney Miller if the Trustees were allowed additional legal counsel, he said the Trustees are allowed but don't have the authority to appoint.

Trustee Roskopf says the separate counsel would not be used for everything but if there were questions, Trustee Bonnie feels this is a prime example.

Trustee Lendi feels this should be handled now and asked President Stillwell if the board feels this is necessary, she wouldn't entertain it. President Stillwell said if there is a clear reason it is

worth the expenditure of taxpayer dollars to do so but not because there is a disagreement. Trustee Roskopf said it isn't because of disagreement but because the Trustees want to have answers. President Stillwell asked if he has ever asked Vasselli Law a question and not gotten an answer. Trustee Roskopf said it is frustrating due to the communication, President Stillwell said they can ask the attorneys anything. Trustee Lendi said she has tried to ask questions multiple times and has gotten very slow responses and incorrect responses. She would like a second attorney to insure proper oversight of operations of the Village.

Trustee Michels said to flip the script and that 6 out of 7 board members were happy with the engineers but now the Village needs to find a new engineering firm.

President Stillwell stated that if Vasselli Law says the Trustees can take a vote and get separate counsel at the taxpayer expense then they would do that. Trustee Roskopf said it is up to her, and she is saying she doesn't want to spend the money and asked what the harm is. President Stillwell said the expense to the taxpayers.

Trustee Bonnie said he feels the entire board is on the same page and it is about the responsibility to taxpayers. He said that Vasselli Law is being paid for representation and they are providing information that is either delayed or possibly incorrect. He would like to see an independent third-party attorney that represents the board and the Village and it is no different than having a second opinion. Trustee Bonnie said another issue is the unprofessionalism shown and feels it is time for the board to explore this option.

President Stillwell clarified if this decision is up to her, Attorney Miller said she has appointment authority. President Stillwell said there will not be a second law firm at this time due to the expense. Trustee Lendi said they have not even gone out to see how much it would cost, how is it too much of an expense. President Stillwell said a second law firm is going to be more expensive than just having one.

Trustee Roskopf wanted to know the difference between getting a new law firm and a new engineer. President Stillwell said she had serious issues with the engineers with ethics and statutes. Trustee Roskopf asked why it is all President Stillwell's decision and not the Trustees opinions as well. President Stillwell stated that she was elected to this position to look out for the constituents, and she will not add a large legal bill from a few disagreements. Trustee Lendi said they don't know how much it would cost.

President Stillwell stated that she has faith in Vasselli Law and they have helped the Village tremendously mentioning all they have done to Trustee Lendi was delay a response to her. Trustee Lendi disagreed and said she had a three-page list of the lack of confidence in the current law firm. President Stillwell said she is not willing to add an expense. Trustee Lendi clarified that the entire board would like to explore this and she does not want too, President Stillwell confirmed.

Trustee Michels said he is happy with Vasselli Law but confirmed for certain situations he would like a second law firm to look at things.

b. Future Village Hall. (Item added by Trustees.)

Administrator Koeppel said he wanted to go through some future village hall options with the board.

The current Village Hall is a space that is being rented and a lease was entered in June 2022, since moving in the building has been sold. He mentioned that a 2-year extension has been enacted due to finance and administration needing a place to go. He stated that the office space is nice for staff, but it is missing a meeting space for the board. If staff stay here for an extended period, he recommends to start looking working on a long-term lease with the property owner.

A site that the Village owns is 30 Municipal Dr. and it is utility ready. Trustee Roskopf said that 19 acres is a large space for a Village Hall. Administrator Koeppel said the thought process was that the village would be larger than it is now when this was purchased. He said some options that could be done with this site would be subdividing it or using it for a commercial site. Trustee Speciale added that at one point it was projected for Sugar Grove to have 60,000 residents which is why this property was bought.

Administrator Koeppel moved onto another option, in accordance to the annexation agreement section 8.2 there is a village hall site that would be a part of the town center. With this option the current lease would need to be extended due to the time frame of Area 3 being built out.

The next option would be to purchase an existing building in the village. He mentioned the building the police department is renting during the remodel, mentioning that it can be cheaper for renovations than new construction.

Administrator Koeppel stated that the police department remodel did take down the capital reserve for village hall. It would be likely that the Village would need to do a referendum funding source also extending debt service or doing a rate levy. He mentioned that there are some alternate funding options with an alternative revenue source. Selling the 30 Municipal Drive set would help offset any money that is borrowed. Trustee Roskopf asked how much this property is worth, Administrator Koeppel is not sure it would need to be assessed.

Trustee Michels asked what size building is needed, Administrator Koeppel said it wouldn't need to be terribly large but would need the appropriately sized room for board meetings. He mentioned that the previous intent was to also bring over Community Development as well. Another option would be to add a community room as well for residents. Trustee Michels asked about staff's opinion on moving Community Development. Administrator Koeppel said this makes sense for the future allowing Public Works to have the space that they need. Trustee Michels asked if the police department is large enough, Administrator Koeppel said yes, mentioning additions that were added.

Trustee Speciale said there was previous discussion about other areas becoming a Village Hall and there should be something about the size of the village hall for the future. Trustee Michels added that there was a lot on Municipal Drive that was considered.

Administrator Koeppel said with the footprint required for a boardroom a remodel could be tough but makes sense to be by the other municipal buildings. Trustee Speciale said one lot had a two-story building and there were space needs sketches done.

President Stillwell said she had previously expressed concerns that the Village needs a \$4 million well and EEI gave a memo confirming that after everything proposed there is 19 gallons per minute remaining. She said she can confirm that there is a proposal for more houses that are not included that put the Village over that amount. She said it is evident that with everything agreed too the Village is negative, the new well would be \$4 million and the Village has \$3.6 million in water infrastructure projects. She feels this makes it hard to commit to a new Village Hall.

Trustee Speciale said there was a Rate Study Committee that covered existing infrastructure replacement. He asked Director Johns if the Maple Ave. water main replacement was covered in the rate study, Director Johns said this was the estimate for IEPA loans, and these loans are not secured at this time so there might be a slightly higher debt interest rate. Director Johns said the \$3.6 Million for Maple and Joy is in the capital plan and the rate study as receiving IEPA loans, the loans are not secured, and she hopes to receive higher scoring. President Stillwell said these are loans, so they are debt.

Trustee Speciale said the rate study was presented to the board earlier this year and it covers existing infrastructure. Director Johns clarified that the rate study was done with Prestbury to determine the estimated rate increases for the next three years. She said the current capital plan calls for \$3.6 million in debt, Trustee Speciale added under revenue and water rates. Trustee Roskopf said this is different than the general fund. President Stillwell mentioned the well, Trustee Speciale said there are tap on fees through the annexation agreements that cover new growth. He said if there is a well she feels needs to be covered on the Crown property there is TIF money. President Stillwell said there is no way to pay \$7.6 million with tap on fees, and to be paid with TIF money it had to be included in the feasibility study, Trustee Speciale disagreed.

Trustee Michels mentioned that there is future development to be determined and contributions can be made to a new well.

Trustee London said she acknowledges that there may be some infrastructure expenses, but this is off topic to the discussion and staff need direction for a village hall. Trustee Michels asked what staff think they need. Administrator Koeppel said a village hall will be needed for a very long time and if it is built correct it could be there for 50+ years. His recommendation would be to build a new village hall and overtime the investment is worth it, but the location is a decision for the board.

Trustee Roskopf explained that they should be focused on the village hall and its needs.

Trustee Michels looks at the new residents as helping to pay for growth as needed, the new residents will be contributing towards a new well and a village hall. He stated that if there was no new development none of this would be needed.

The Trustees agreed that a new well is not currently needed.

Trustee Bonnie said this will take awhile to get done and asked at looking at another lease term in the meantime mentioning that newly elected officials might like to have a say as well. Administrator Koeppel says he agrees and if the board is in agreeance him and Director Johns can begin negotiating a new lease with extensions.

Trustee Speciale mentioned finding the space needs analysis as well.

Trustee London said she agrees with what has been decided but would like to keep it centrally located in the Village she feels The Grove is too far away.

14. Reports

a. Staff

Administration – Nothing to add.

Finance – Trustee Michels asked for the audit to be sent early.

Trustee Lendi requested Director Johns to gather invoices for Vasselli Law.

Community Development – Trustee Michels said there was a long wait time for an inspection and mentioned getting another building inspector. Director Marion said last week was the new inspector's first week and he is catching on quickly, but they are limited to 20 hours per week with him. She said the volume of inspections has tripled as well.

Trustee London asked if the demolition permit for the motel was issued, Director Marion said yes and it was torn down.

Police Department – Chief Rollins gave an update on Sugar Grove Parkway, IDOT will be replacing a second beam. He mentioned the detour route on Route 56.

Trustee Michels asked how the police station is coming along, Chief Rollins said hopefully by the end of the month or early October they will have the station back.

Administrator Koeppel added that they will be holding two days where residents can get a tour of the police department.

Trustee Lendi mentioned flock cameras and wanted Chief Rollins to refresh everyone on the precautions taken with the information obtained from them. Chief Rollins said in 2023 the board

authorized 4 flock cameras, and they were temporarily placed throughout the village. He stated that what is being seen nationally is misconceptions of what flock does.

Last year the board approved 4 more cameras so now the village has 8. He explained that the data that is captured stays in Sugar Grove stating that Illinois has one of the most restrictive uses for automatic license plate readers. Typically, the data is only stored for 30 days, the cameras do not catch every license plate, and you usually cannot see the driver or passengers.

He mentioned the license plate reads for August show over 3,000 vehicles recorded that are in a database that is of interest for law enforcement. He stated that there are certain things that cannot be searched for such as healthcare reproductive purposes, immigration, etc. They are used for those who are wanted, sex offenders, gang members, terrorists, etc. Out of the searches performed there were two events in Sugar Grove for vehicle break ins. The cameras were used for criminal activity using investigative leads.

Chief Rollins explained that if the data is misused from the cameras officers can face disciplinary actions. He mentioned that over 90% of crimes solved through their systems are solved within 7 days, Flocks recommendation was to retain 7 days' worth of data.

President Stillwell asked when the contract is up for renewal, Chief Rollins said it is renewed every year and there is an annual fee. She asked if they have helped at all with fast cars in the community, Chief Rollins said no due to the placement of where the cameras are at. President Stillwell asked if there could be a report of how many crimes were solved within a time frame to analyze the ongoing risk vs. benefit.

Trustee Michels said it might be beneficial to revisit this when the contract comes back as well.

Chief Rollins said the cameras are beneficial and he would love to have more officers but can't be everywhere.

President Stillwell asked if there was any way the cameras could be moved to where drag racing happens in the village due to less officers working at night. Chief Rollins said those who race switch locations.

Public Works – Trustee Michels asked for an update on the widening project, Director Merkel said they are still waiting on the railroad.

President Stillwell asked what work was being done at 47 & Prairie, Director Merkel said a gas line project.

Trustee Lendi asked what the Illinois IEPA Cap is, Director Merkel doesn't know. President Stillwell stated it is firm capacity, the amount that a village is able to pump with their existing well minus the largest well. She said that 2,400 is the firm capacity, if this is reached the IEPA

puts the village on a restricted list and stops issuing permits. Director Merkel said they do not have a restricted list, Trustee Speciale agreed.

Trustee Speciale went through calculations between the four main wells in the village with the board explaining that he doesn't see the need for another well. He stated that he was the one who commissioned the water study when he was Public Works Director, he thought there was an error and redid the numbers and another well is not needed.

President Stillwell said it doesn't sound like he was familiar with the IEPA firm capacity and there is a limit that is able to be pumped. She said if the 1,125 units are approved then there is more agreed to on paper than the capacity to pump.

Director Merkel said to revisit the water study and see the needs.

Trustee Michels said the village is not close to the capacity. President Stillwell explained the proposed and approved homes within the village.

b. Trustees

Trustee Lendi – Trustee Lendi attended the library board meeting on the 26th and there will be a fundraiser held on the 17th at culvers from 5pm – 8pm.

Trustee London – Trustee London attended a meeting about data centers. She said there is a lot of different information out about data centers and overall issues include water consumption, electrical consumption, and noise. It comes down to what type of equipment is going into the buildings, evaporative cooling systems use significantly more water. In the near future, brown outs are predicted due to power usage as well. The positives listed for data centers were the tax dollars and short-term jobs.

She explained that when dealing with the noise, walls are often put up but vibration studies are being required due to cracking foundations of nearby properties.

Trustee Speciale – Trustee Speciale stated that discussed in executive session were things for the Administrator to work on. One suggestion was to add a Committee of the Whole due to concerns behind answering President Stillwell's questions. Trustee Speciale would like a report on impact fees in annexation agreements and the anticipated revenue from these agreements.

Administrator Koeppel said he will gather information on the Committee of the Whole for the board.

Trustee Michels – Trustee Michels wants to have staffs' opinions on the report provided on capacity.

Trustee Roskopf – No report.

Trustee Bonnie – No report.

b. President

President Stillwell mentioned that IDOT sent out the Hanks Road Bridge updated LOU and to her knowledge there have been so objections and they added the bridge joints as the board requested. Trustee Speciale said that not everything that was in the email was gained and at this point he is against it because it encumbers money the village doesn't have. President Stillwell said she brought this to the board before and they added the bridge joints and resurfacing. She does not want to cause any delays, Trustee Speciale is opposed as well as Trustee Bonnie, Trustee Lendi, and Trustee London. Director Merkel also has the same concerns about the resurfacing. President Stillwell stated that this letter is for this project not 20 years in the future. Director Merkel said they included the bridge joints, President Stillwell said they explained why that could be added but not the resurfacing but there is an email from IDOT stating they will cover the resurfacing. Trustee Speciale said there still need to be beams up and deck replacement. Trustee Bonnie asked if this email would be justifiable. Attorney Miller said given the history he feels all expectations should be in the agreement rather than an email. President Stillwell said resurfacing can't be added; Trustee Speciale opposes the agreement.

Administrator Koeppel said to his understanding they have accepted understanding for the bridge joints, the surface is the village's responsibility, but they will pay the cost or resurface it in 20 years. The reason why this wouldn't be included is because the surface is the village's responsibility so this would be incorporated as a project they would do in the future.

Trustee Speciale feels this brings the village back to where it started, President Stillwell disagrees and is worried about residents' safety.

Administrator Koeppel asked if Trustee Speciale would like something more than an email, Trustee Speciale said it needs to be within the agreement. Attorney Miller asked if they could get a side letter would that suffice.

President Stillwell asked if they could tell them to resurface the bridge if it is the village's surface, Attorney Miller would prefer to have an agreement.

President Stillwell doesn't feel this is worth risking lives and residents have shown concerns.

President Stillwell said the water report that was not paid was paid this week. She went to the Aurora Visitors Conventions Bureau and is working on additional marketing for the future.

Trustee Roskopf asked if the water study was paid for originally, she said Crown had agreed to pay for the study, and the previous Community Development Director said the report had less than favorable information and the invoice was never submitted. Administrator Koeppel clarified that EEI commissioned the study through the water authority and the village paid EEI back. Director Johns had found out it was not to be paid for escrow but from the Community Development budget. He explained that this was a transfer from Crown to the general fund.
