Permits Required for Parkway Tree Planting

The Village of Sugar Grove would like to remind residents that planting trees in the parkway is prohibited without a permit as outlined in Village Code Section 7-4-7. Planting permits, and the accompanying guidelines, help to ensure that healthy trees appropriate for right-of-way planting are selected throughout the Village. This helps prevent future visibility problems and tree decline.

If you wish to plant a tree in the parkway, you must first submit an application to the Public Works Department. Permission is needed for the specific location, species, size and spacing of trees. Additionally the area between three (3) feet and eight (8) feet above grade is to be free and clear of obstructions.

Each spring and fall, the Village offers a 50/50 Parkway Tree Program. Residents interested in this split cost program should contact the Public Works Department to be added to the list.

Please note, trees planted in the parkway without a permit will be ordered to be removed and shrubs are never allowed in the parkway.

Premise Alert Program

The Illinois Premise Alert Program encourages people with disabilities or special needs, or their caregivers, to provide information to police, fire and EMS personnel that will allow them to more effectively respond to emergency situations involving citizens with these needs. Village Water Conservation Restrictions

Water conservation measures are an important first step in protecting our water supply. All properties connected to the Village Water System must adhere to the following water restrictions:

- Even-numbered street addresses may water on even-numbered calendar dates between the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

- Odd-numbered street addresses may water on odd-numbered calendar dates between the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Residents are reminded that per the Village of Sugar Grove Municipal Code, lawns should be maintained at a height no greater than eight inches (8").

Keep Your Curb Clear

When maintaining your lawn this summer, please remember to not discharge grass clippings into the street and gutter. Grass and other debris can clog up stormwater drains and lead to street flooding during rainstorms. Wet grass in the street also poses a danger to motorcyclists and bicyclists.
