## FIRE SERVICE COLLABORATIVE

Often times in our neighborhoods we see fire apparatus or life squads from other communities serving the needs of our residents. The Hamilton County Fire Chief's Association has provided long term mutual aid assistance to communities for decades. This valuable resource aids neighbors in need by bringing together a large group of

first responders. The fire service in Hamilton County has been working together in a regional concept, or collaborative arrangement, long before 911.

In April of 1999 when an F3 tornado devastated areas of Blue Ash, Montgomery, Symmes Township and Sycamore Township, mutual aid groups from the City of Cincinnati, Warren County and Butler County came together to help the affected communities.

Today this concept is part of a huge state wide mutual aid program that provides emergency resources during any type of emergency. This program came about through the Ohio Fire Chief's Association. Regionalization of a Hazardous Materials Response Team and the Urban Search and Rescue Team known as the Hamilton County USAR Team all serve the residents of Southwest Ohio, Northern Kentucky and the eastern part of Indiana.

Fire chiefs realized years ago that communities were better served through a regional approach to training teams in on-scene incident management, hazardous materials, terrorism, mass casualties, and technical rescue responses. These highly trained individuals can then share their knowledge with and train personnel in their own department.

Recently Sycamore Township, Symmes Township, the cities of Blue Ash, Sharonville, Loveland and Mason created a closer working relationship called the

Northeast Fire Collaborative. The goals are to achieve maximum purchasing power, shared training, coordinated response, incident management, risk policies, fireground safety and a uniform approach to the Hamilton County Fire Chief's Standard Operating Guidelines on various topics that affect all fireground operations. The Collaborative also recognized the need to share costs to further economize during tough economic times while providing the best service to our communities.

The Collaborative members maintain the individual communities they serve are foremost and the need to remain autonomous is key. However, working together enables the departments to achieve more efficient operations and share valuable resources. Since the Northeast Fire Collaborative announced their formation, other departments in the county are now organizing regional workgroups as well. Just like in our own homes, working with our neighbors generates friendship, a better understanding of help and provides a safer environment for everyone.

The men and women of Sycamore Township EMS & Fire Department are honored to be a part of this great community and stand ready to serve the residents 24/7 365 days a year. Our training, equipment, and response times continue to be our benchmark for making sure that every call for assistance is met with courtesy and kindness in a professional manner.

## "THOSE WHO HOST LOSE THE MOST"

We are quickly approaching graduation time. This is a time of great joy for both parents and their children. Along with graduation, come graduation parties. While we all want everyone to have a great time, I want to remind you that if your children and their friends are under the age of 21, it is illegal to provide them with alcohol.

If you are caught hosting a party where underage drinking is occurring, you will be subject to arrest. It is a misdemeanor of the first degree to host this type of party. You can be subject to up to six months in jail and a one thousand dollar fine. Besides the criminal sanctions, if one of the children attending suffers physical harm or is involved in an auto accident, you can be civilly responsible and it can be devastating to your financial stability. I cannot even imagine the grief that you may feel, in addition to all the legal ramifications, if your child or one of their friends is injured or killed.

Once again, I hope that all of the graduates have a great time at their parties. I know the joy of not only having my children graduate from high school but also from college. Please keep in mind these reminders of the dangers of underage consumption of alcohol at your parties. Do not provide alcohol for you child or their guests and be vigilant in making sure that your child's friends don't bring alcohol to their parties. It is simply true, "Those who host lose the most."

#### **CONTEST OVERVIEW**

When people beautify their property the whole neighborhood wins! Property values are enhanced and the neighborhood becomes more attractive and desirable. The Sycamore Township Beautification Award is a challenge designed to recognize exceptional properties which have contributed to keeping Sycamore Township beautiful. Our goal is to applaud the owners of properties who have taken extra measures to achieve noticeable improvements that have impacted our community and to develop better and stronger relationships with local government and its residents. Awards will be presented annually for township properties based on the following:

#### **CRITERIA**

- exhibits pride in their home
- ✓ shows excellence in exterior home upkeep and maintenance
- shows creativeness in the exterior of the home in relation to the surrounding neighborhood
- must not have any current property violations

#### **CATEGORIES**

The Sycamore Township Beautification Awards will be given to 3 residential properties which beautify the Township. First prize is the Rose Award, second prize is the Tulip Award and third prize is the Hosta Award.

#### **IUDGING**

All properties will be reviewed and judged by Township Department head staff.

#### **NOMINATIONS**

Nominations to be judged may be submitted by property owners, friends, neighbors, etc. Applications may be found below or at our website www.sycamoretownship.org.

#### **RULES**

Winners are not eligible to win more than once in a three year period.

#### **DEADLINE**

All nominations must be postmarked by Friday, July 30, 2010. Judging will be held in the month of August. Winners will be announced in September.

#### **AWARD WINNERS**

Award Winners will be welcomed by the Township Board of Trustees at a special awards ceremony where beautification certificates will be awarded. Special recognition on the Township web site and newsletter and a gracious gift certificate to local businesses will be given.

Trash, junk, debris, tires, old construction materials, furniture, lawn mowers and appliances of all sorts will be accepted.

Please note that paint, chemicals, pesticides and yard waste including leaves, limbs and brush will not be accepted. Be prepared to show proof of residency. A valid driver's license or utility bill with your Sycamore Township address will be accepted.

The Township will provide free compost and wood chips on Saturday, September 25 from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm. The material may be picked up at the Township's compost site adjacent to Hartzell United Methodist Church Parking Lot at 8999 Applewood Drive.

Maintenance personnel will be on hand to assist you in loading the material. There is an abundant supply of both compost and wood chips so come early and come often. No rain date has been set at this time.

## STORM DAMAGE COLLECTION

When storms pass through Sycamore Township, you can rest assured that we are looking out for you! Storm damage collection is a service Sycamore Township has provided for many years through the maintenance department. The storm damage policy of the Township begins with the safety services department. Sycamore Township Fire Chief Jetter declares whether a "storm damage condition" has occurred. When a "storm damage condition" has been declared, residents must call 791-8447 within two working days after the storm to have the branches picked up at no charge. **Branches** must be stacked at the street, butt end out, within two (2) weeks of the storm. When you call, tell the office staff that you have storm damage, give them your name, address and phone number. It is not the policy of Sycamore Township to cover the whole Township street by street after a storm, but rather collecting from only the addresses reported to the office. The maintenance department will only pick up limbs and branches from the recent storm. Leaves, which are picked up during our annual fall "leaf season", will not be collected. Foundation plantings, old firewood, and tree and bush pruning will not be collected as storm damage. They can be disposed of through your trash collection or at our monthly brush chipping program held behind the Sycamore Township Maintenance Building, 8540 Kenwood Road, from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. on the first Saturday of each month.
