2. Adoption of Minutes from the February 6, 2019 Meeting

Commission Member Alex McKay made a motion, seconded by Commission Member Bill Revis, to approve the minutes of the February 6, 2019 meeting as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

B. BUSINESS ITEMS:

1. Comprehensive Land Use Plan Update

Ms. Elizabeth Teague, Director of Development Services presented to the Commission the Waynesville 2035 Comprehensive Land Use Plan Update. She presented a slideshow and explained to the Commission the Smart Growth Framework based on ten key principles. She reviewed the current vision statement and the new vision statement. She also discussed key themes, such as housing variety and historic preservation.

Ms. Teague requested the Commission's feedback to assist with the draft's goals and objectives primarily related to the Chapter on Historic and Cultural Resources. She asked for the Commission members to look over the Chapter and send back any comments and suggestions. Ms. Teague also asked if there were any vision goals or objectives the Commission would like to see added to send these in also.

2. Finalization of 2019 Speaker Series Arrangements

Mr. Byron Hickox, Land Use Administrator, reminded the Commission that the Speaker Series would begin March 7, with speaker Alex McKay. April's speaker will be Patrick Womack and Nancy Watkins in May.

3. Discussion of Workshop for Historic Property Owners

Mr. Hickox gave an update on details regarding the workshop for historic property owners. He said that the workshop will also be open to everyone in the Haywood County community for anyone interested in learning about historic preservation. He advised that Annie McDonald and Jennifer Cathey from SHPO, State Historic Preservation Office, will be putting the workshop on. They will get back to Mr. Hickox with four to five dates for the Commission to choose from. They agreed to a 7 p.m. evening workshop time.

4. Other Business

Vice-Chair McKay reported that former HPC member, Bette Sprecher, passed away in the last month. He led a discussion about the possibilities of a plaque honoring her as the first woman Alderman in Waynesville and possibly a memorial bench. Ms. Teague advised she would check on these two ideas with the Town.

Subject: Proposed Greenhill Cemetery Signs

The Greenhill Cemetery has been recently added to the National Register of Historic Places which is a tremendous honor. The cemetery is most visible from South Main Street which is a heavily traveled road leading to downtown, but passersby are not made aware of this significant cemetery. From Shelton Street, there is nothing to mark the entrance of the cemetery either.

The Historic Preservation Commission proposes to add a sign at the two intersections which you can access the cemetery from — Hillview Circle/Veterans Circle and Shelton Street/Golden Drive. The proposed signs would be sandblasted wood panel mounted on wood posts. Also, the colors would be black and white for as timeless and historic appearance. Approximate sign panel dimensions would be 48 inches wide by 30 inches tall. Some simple, beautiful, low maintenance landscaping with everblooming roses or evergreen shrubs around the base of the signs would really provide an attractive setting and the contrast would draw attention to the signs. An additional proposed feature would be for the signs to be lit for better visibility at night.

To enhance the main the entrance route on Hillview Circle, the HPC requests to have the two cemetery regulation signs moved to further up Hillview Circle.
