New Business:

-Monthly Review and Newsletter was distributed.

-There are 20 students in the **Yoga** class, however there are no **Aerobics** classes this summer.

The **Horse Camp** has 8 participants this first week. The maximum number of participants is 16.

The camp is 8 weeks in length. **Spotlights Theater** Camp is full, with 20 youth in the program.

Swim Lessons are full for the month of June. **Private Swim Lessons** are available. The

Summer Camp is full, with 30 youth. **AYSO Soccer** has one more sign-up on June 21. **T-Ball**

has finished the season last week after several rain outs. **Men Softball** is still underway.

-Every week day in June has at least one group coming to use the pool. Some days we have five groups through out the day.

-The **summer swim** team has 88 participants. We will host the annual Kick-Off meet this Saturday, June 14 from 7am until 7pm. The pool will be closed to use by the public, however everyone is invited to the meet.

-**Join Hands Day** is June 21 and volunteers will help to replace the mulch in the playground with CPSC approved ground cover.

-**Relay For Life** will be held at the track on June 20 and 21.

In response to the tremendous request for music in the weight room, we have contracted with the Muzak company to provide us with music in the center. This will be installed in July. They will also provide the ASCAP requirements which lets us play recorded music. We have also secured

a license from the Motion Picture Licensing Corporation which allows us to show videos.

-Helen Geltman is in charge of our Horse Camp and she has requested that permission to erect a holding corral at the horse ring. Lumber and labor has been donated. Lee made the motion to allow this and Dot second. All were in favor.

-The outdoor pool has been demolished by NEO Corp. The area is undergoing a settling period at this point but in July we will stone the area for short term parking. Parking is at a premium during evening hours with ball games, tennis players, and playground users. The commission will need to develop a plan for the area once the ground has settled.
