### MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 5:40 pm.

In attendance were: Kenny Mull, Ginny Boyer, Michelle Claytor, Lee Starnes, Don Frady, Wallace Messer, Sarah Massie, Rhonda Schandavel and Rhett Langston. Scotty Schulhofer was unable to attend.

The minutes from the February 8, 2011, meeting were approved by Lee Starnes. Sarah Massie second it.

#### Old Business:

- None

#### New Business:

- The adult basketball league is going well. Also, we have had a lot of interest in volleyball usage. One particular group has expressed interest in renting the courts four times a year for a tournament.
- We installed a fan in the aquatics area for the purpose increasing the air quality for swimmers. It has been well received. In addition to pulling in air from the outside without effecting the overall maintenance structure of the pool it will also suck out hot air in the summer.
- We have agreed with Lifespan to place artwork in the upstairs workout area. The paintings are for sell and Lifespan would keep the proceeds. Lifespan has also agreed to periodically swap the pictures out in order to keep everything looking new.
- We now have set operating hours for the new game room. Attendants will be staffing and programming the room.
- The brain gym is now in place at the Old Armory. We will also order two 32 inch flat screens to be installed for seniors to play the Wii. This should be open within the next few weeks.
- We have the brochures for the skate park ready and will soon begin to be distributed to area businesses. I made a formal presentation to Ingles for the remainder of the amount needed to be raised, \$165,000, in order to complete the first phase. The total amount needed will be \$293,000. We have \$128,000.
- The Advisory Commission was asked to vote on a request by a citizen to use the Pepsi Dog Park for a fundraiser. The event would be a dog show for Cystic Fibrosis. The Advisory Commission agreed to charge the individual an amount of \$50 and an additional \$50 deposit to be refunded if everything was cleaned. Also, a certificate of liability insurance would have to be given to the Waynesville Parks and Recreation Department.
- The Fitness Challenge will begin on March 14. This will last until May 10. The Waynesville Recreation Center and the Old Armory Recreation Center will participate on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.
- The Pepsi Dog Park bridge has been removed. People will need to use the walking trail to access the park.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:25 pm.
