From the Mayor's Desk



Dear Neighbors,

Our long and sometimes harsh winters can make us question if summer will ever arrive, but lo and behold it is here. So much has been happening it will be difficult to keep this short. In May, Alanna Whitmore took the oath of office for Village Trustee. Alanna will have trustee oversight for the Department of Parks and Recreation and we are all looking forward to working with her as she jumps in with both feet. Alanna's election fills the seat vacated by long-time Trustee Dick Robards. Over the years Dick had made significant contributions toward our village's progress, and though he will no longer be a sitting board member we are pleased to know he will remain engaged in the community.

Also in May, the Village Board approved the designation of a new TIF (tax increment financing) district that encompasses most of the commercial corridor along Sheridan Road and on 7th Street from Whitney Ave. east to the train tracks. The rationale for considering this new, expanded TIF is an understanding of the need to pursue a strategy to revitalize properties and promote development within the Village's primary commercial corridor by attracting private investment. An analysis of what has taken place on its own in the past has led to an understanding that the needed private investment would only be possible if encouraged by adopting a TIF. This is a significant initiative for our Village and we are confident the TIF will provide for community and economic development opportunities not available before now.

It appears that our efforts to strengthen intergovernmental relations has borne fruit. When I took office I emphasized the necessity for strengthening relations with our federal, state, and county partners to move programs and initiatives forward. I also knew that to relieve some of the burden from our taxpayers we needed financial support from the vertical levels of government. I am pleased to let you know that with the support of State Representative Joyce Mason and State Senator Melinda Bush, HB 0062 passed both chambers of the General Assembly and at this writing is waiting for the Governor's signature. This House Bill contains language designating over \$617,000 to Winthrop Harbor for the desperately needed replacement of our Public Works building. A structure that was literally falling apart. In addition, SB 0262 was signed by the Governor on June 5th designating \$375,000 for repairs and improvements at North Point Marina. We have worked tirelessly to share our vision for Winthrop Harbor and these efforts have been recognized with legislative and financial support. We thank Representative Mason and Senator Bush for their support.

As you drive through the village you will begin to see signs reading "Moving Winthrop Harbor Forward". These signs are being placed in areas where capital improvement projects are taking place. Though we have road work scheduled for this summer we are working diligently to expand our road rehabilitation initiative; making every effort and turning over every stone to repair and replace as many roads as possible in the shortest amount of time. I and the Village Board are committed to finding the funding necessary to make this happen.

Last month we brought on staff Gregory Jackson as Winthrop Harbor's first Village Administrator. As Chief Administrative Officer Greg will oversee the day-to-day operations of the village departments while reporting to the village board. This appointment was necessary to move the village forward. Greg served the last two years as a policy and administration consultant and was invaluable in helping us move our intergovernmental relations program forward. Greg has served as a county administrator, city manager, executive director of a statewide non-profit as well as a professor of public administration. I am sure you will meet Greg as he continues to make his way around our village.

Recreation Programs

Walkin' Walkin':

Looking for a way to stay in shape this summer without having to be outside? The Schlader Recreation Center will be open for walking 8am – 10am Monday – Friday this summer. The gymnasium is available for all who wish to participate, and there is no charge.

Are you a stay at home parent with small children, and looking for another way to get a little exercise? Monday – Friday 10AM – 11AM the gymnasium at the Schlader Rec. Center will be open to those of you who have toddlers/children at home, and would have to bring them with to participate in the open walking session.. Please keep in mind, everyone participating will have a children



with them, and each adult will be responsible for their own children. There will be a few items available for children to play with in the middle of the gym, but each person may want to bring a couple items for your child to keep busy with.

The Recreation staff is not responsible for keeping an eye on any children present.

WH Youth Fall Baseball/Softball League

Registrations will be accepted for the 2020 Youth Fall Season, during the weeks of July 15th – August 2nd. League fees for each age group will be \$50. Ages offered for boys will be Pinto (7-8 yrs), Mustang (9-10yrs), Bronco (11-12yrs), and Pony (13-14 yrs). Ages offered for girls will be 8U,10U, 12U, and 14U. Players are encouraged to sign up in the age bracket they will have to play in the 2020 Spring season. Age-cutoff dates for 2020 season are 1/1/2020 for girls, and 4/1/2020 for boys. So if a girl is 13 yrs old on 1/1/20, then she would register for the 14U team in the Fall.. If a boy turns 11 yrs old on 4/2/20, they could either choose to play at the Mustang level in the Fall and Spring, or move up to Bronco Level.. Spots are limited, and on a first come, first serve basis. There will only be 36 spots max, open for each age level. The first 14 registered in each age group are guaranteed a space, while a minimum of 22 registrations must be received in order to have enough players to accommodate 2 teams at an age level. Sign up early, as spaces will fill up quick!! Teams will practice no more than 2 times a week, and games will be scheduled on Saturdays, with Sundays used as make-ups, during Aug. 24th – Oct 20th. Baseball and softball will play surrounding communities as they do during the spring season.

You may also turn in fees and registration forms to the WH Village Hall, 830 Sheridan Rd, Mon-Fri between 8am-4pm, or drop off completed forms and check in the lock box, located outside the front door of Village Hall, anytime of day or night, during the registration period. 2019 Winthrop Harbor Beatification Program

Over twenty-five (25) volunteers of The Illinois Dunesland Garden Club provided their assistance and knowledge to the Department of Public Works for the annual Beautification Program on June 1st.

The Garden Club brought decades of knowledge and spent countless hours planning and organizing the program. They picked each flower from the nursery and even scheduled and directed volunteers that came out on that rainy, Saturday morning.

They were able to plant flowers in 36 flower pots, three flower beds, and numerous hanging pots throughout the village.

The Beautification Program was started in by Kurt Melander many years ago. Melander was a village resident who volunteered uncountable hours maintaining the Beautification Program each year. After his retirement, the village wanted his legacy to live on and The Garden Club exceeded those expectations.

Only Rain Down the Drains!

Only Rain Down the Drain! Storm drains and roadside ditches lead to our inland lakes, streams, rivers and Lake Michigan. So, any motor oil, pet waste, leaves, grass clippings or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our water without being treated. Never dump motor oil, chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain or into a ditch. All of these materials pollute our lakes and rivers! Pollutants that get into storm drains can poison fish, birds, and other wildlife, and can find their way into drinking water supplies. In addition, dirt, litter, branches and grass clippings can clog storm drains and cause flooding. Be sure to report anyone dumping materials into a storm drain or ditch to village officials.

CONTRACTOR AND INSPECTOR: The contract for this work has been awarded to Chicagoland Paving Inc. of Lake Zurich, IL as the general contractor for this year's program. Baxter & Woodman, Inc. is the village's contracted engineering firm and will have an on-site engineer to complete construction inspections for the work and be the liaison to the village in the field.

START DATES & COMPLETION DATES: The contractor will not be working on all streets at one time, but will be splitting the work up in the community. We are working with the contractor to determine the exact start dates, but generally anticipate the work to start in July. The roadway work is scheduled to be completed in mid-August with restoration to take place in September. Vacation House Watch Program

Residents may register for our Vacation House Watch program on-line through the Action-Line at www.whpd.org, or by visiting the Police Department in person (registration may not be made over the phone). As requests are only processed during regular business hours, we ask residents to submit their registration at least 48-hours in advance of your travel. Requests received after hours are processed the next business day.

Move over, Slow down!

There have been too many emergency workers struck by vehicles in Illinois over the last few months so we thought it would be a good time to remind residents of Illinois "Scott's Law".

Scott's Law was named after Lt. Scott Gillen of the Chicago Fire Department who was struck and killed by a drunk driver while working a crash scene.

The law requires drivers to **slow down** and **move over**, if possible, when approaching a stopped emergency vehicle, or any vehicle with flashing lights.

Please keep this in mind as you travel this summer, all of our roadside workers will appreciate it.

New Hands Free Law July 1st

A new law goes into effect on July 1st that increases the penalty for texting and driving. If caught, drivers will now receive a moving violation, even for your first offense, which could affect your driving record.

As a reminder, it is illegal to have any electronic device in your hands while driving, including while at a stop light or sitting in traffic. It is also illegal to use a cell phone, even hands free, in a school zone, within a construction zone, within 500 feet of an emergency scene, or if you are under 18 years old.

Happy summer greetings from all of us at WHFD! Did you know that roughly 75% of the emergency calls we respond to are medical in nature? That's right, even though the big fires and bad traffic crashes usually make the news headlines, most of what we do on a daily basis is transport sick and injured persons to hospitals. For this issue of our newsletter, we'll detail a few of our more common calls and briefly discuss what you may be able to do to help avoid those situations!

One of the most common type of medical call we respond to is an injury from a fall. Many may believe it is only our population more advanced in age that fall and need help, but we see all ages fall and hurt themselves, and for a variety of reasons! We would like to point out that it is very important to be as safe as possible when using ladders around the house, leaning over a tight area to get that last nail pounded in, or anywhere you may find yourself where both feet aren't able to be firmly on the ground!

If you are more advanced in age and find your mobility has decreased, it is very important to take a few extra safety steps around the house. First, when you wake up in the morning, we suggest that you sit on the side of your bed for a minute or two while you fully wake up and get ready to face the day. We have seen many quickly hop out of bed and lose their balance because they didn't take a moment to get their wits about themselves! Also very important, try to limit trip hazards around your residence: loose rugs and electrical cords of all types are easy ways to accidentally trip and fall. Perhaps you have an uneven floor tile or wood slat that you've been meaning to get fixed for a while – please do so! We also see many falls in bathrooms; maybe it's time you consider handrails in and around your shower or tub?

Another very common call we respond to is chest pain and trouble breathing.

A building permit is required for most projects from new construction or renovations to a new fence or replacement windows. 
Winthrop Harbor has, is, and will always be in my heart. I look forward to representing the village for many years to come.

The main thought we want to pass along is that we are here for you, and don't want you to delay calling if you start to experience chest or breathing related symptoms!
